Washing eye within the first few seconds is essential to achieve maximum effectiveness. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists, get medical advice/attention.
In Case of Ingestion:	Do not induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Drink large amounts of water. If vomiting occurs, keep airways open. Keep head lower than hips to prevent aspiration into the lungs. Get medical advice/attention.
